PASTORAL LETTER

Hero worship – probably we all have our heroes. One local hero of mine is The Whistling Postman, Dale Howting. You may have seen him sitting astride his stationary bicycle, with its big, black charity box, on Friday or Saturday in Sittingbourne High Street or in Homebase. Weather, health, and holidays permitting, he tries not to let a day pass without going out somewhere on his mission. Originally, Dale was a postman who whistled loudly and cheerfully as he cycled around his route. But a complaint led to the Post Office instructing him to maintain silence on one section of his circuit. The resulting notoriety eventually gave rise to the lifelong charity drive of The Whistling Postman. Over the years, his goal became to collect £250,000 before his 80th birthday. He reached his charity target in August 2014, and his target birthday in September of that year. He had been honoured in 2012 by carrying the Olympic Torch for Sittingbourne, carrying it into Birchington-on-sea. In May 2013, he presented the torch to the Mayor of Swale to be on permanent display. But all this hasn't slowed him down. On Fridays and Saturdays, you can still see him, cheerful and friendly, at one of his accustomed posts. During the Queen's Birthday Celebrations, he was out in fine style, his bicycle bedecked with the Union Jack, and with all four national flags. Dale is still going strong, not giving up his mission, just because one goal was reached, but reaching out for more. He is a real, living example of St Paul's teachings – to be constant in well doing, and never to think you have done it all, but to press on to win the final crown. God grant Dale many more years of bringing cheer to the High Street, and charity to all the good causes he supports.

UGANDAN PROJECT

At a benefice churchwardens' meeting Jackie Swift, our churchwarden, learned of a project that Lesley Ambrose, who grew up in Hartlip, is working on with deprived children in Uganda. As a result Lower Halstow Parochial Church Council, and therefore our church, has donated towards Lesley's urgent needs, and Jackie has received the following letter:

Dear Jackie,

It was so good to meet you at last and I was so grateful for the warm and loving welcome I received from you all. I'm glad that I had the opportunity to share about God's work in Uganda and thankful that people were so willing to help us. On behalf of our church I want to convey my thanks to you and Lower Halstow church for your generous donation of £103 pounds towards the children's meals. David and Andrew have now purchased the saucepan, charcoal and stove plus mugs. We plan to give the children porridge after their club next Saturday.

I know that the children in Lower Halstow and Upchurch would like to link with our children. We will have to work on the writing and exchange of letters and pictures.

You may have heard that I received a wonderful welcome at the airport when 10 of our children ran up to give me hugs. The children plus five adults all managed to squeeze into one taxi. We also had a rousing service on Wednesday evening and I was able to report on all that I had done. Everyone was very happy and grateful to God for my safe return. The children ate all the biscuits I had brought and blew up their new footballs. It was good to be back.

Thank you again so very much, you are making a big difference to the lives of our children. We will keep you updated on our progress and hope to send some pictures. With our love, Lesley.
